What a story! We're almost there!

With further donations since our last newsletter in October 2008, we now have only \$10,000 reach our goal of \$220,000.

### **Completed projects include:**

- Repairs to the slate roofs of the church and vestry including the replacement of lead flashing and capping
- Replacement of the roof of the passageway between church and vestry
- Removal and replacement of tuck pointing on the external walls of the church, vestry and schoolmaster's house
- Renewal of all guttering and downpipes on the church, vestry and schoolmaster's house and the replacement of two galvanised water tanks
- External painting of the church, vestry and adjoining passageway
- New toilet facilities and a storeroom have been constructed.
- Replacement of all underground water pipes that supply river water to the church property and the installation of a new pump
- Paving has been taken up and repositioned so that we now have a level area for the serving of devonshire teas
- The fence across the middle of the property has been removed, fill has been brought in and levelled and the whole area has been turfed.
- Replacement of the roof of the pavilion (church hall)
- Access to the pavilion has been improved, for people using walkers and wheelchairs and for people entering church property through the gate near the pavilion.
- The pavilion kitchen has been renovated.
- The river bank has been cleaned up and a safety fence has been erected around power boxes.

#### Projects in progress include:

- Conservation of the bread oven
- The church porch
- The first floor rooms in the schoolmaster's house.
- Removing or dead-wooding dangerous trees on church property


Historical walk-and-talks in church grounds and to the nearby landing beach and quarry.
